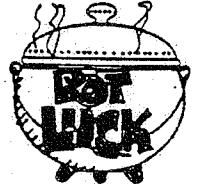

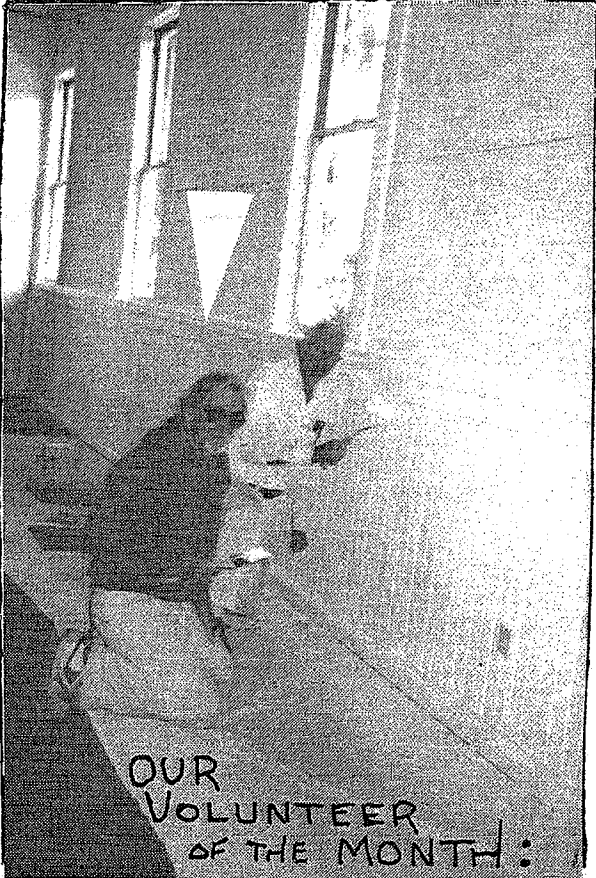
# PRESIDENT'S PAGE

 From Merced, Calif.

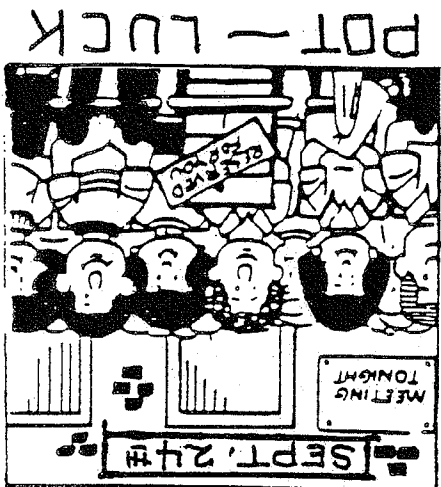
Alice (Webb) Johnson and Nadine (Webb) Allinson, the

We hope to be at the Hometown Reunion Oct. 28.



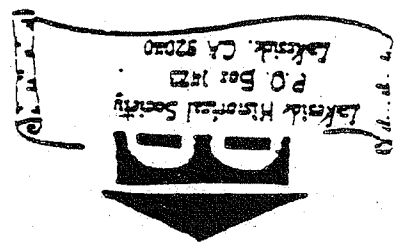


A swarm of Africanized bees stung a Mexican and his horse to death near Acapulco. Forty-year-old Leobardo Mayares died after being stung about 70 times, but his son managed to escape the attack. The Africanized bees, commonly known as "killer bees," have been migrating northward at a rate of about 200 miles per year, and are predicted to reach the United States at the Texas Rio Grande Valley by late this summer.

**Earliest known land vertebrate had feet with more than 5 toes**

Naturalists have long assumed that the same process of evolution that produced four-footed vertebrates, or tetrapods, gave them feet normally equipped with five digits each.


But new evidence suggests that the tetrapod line, which includes mankind, started out without any fixed number of fingers or toes and that the norm of five evolved only later on.

In a paper in the British journal *Nature*, Michael I. Coates and Jennifer A. Clack of Cambridge University reported that two specimens of the earliest land vertebrate species to be found both had more than five toes on each foot. The fossils were discovered recently in 360-million-year-old rocks in eastern Greenland.


The two salamander-like amphibians had eight and seven toes per foot. The only other known tetrapod fossil as old as these two is that of an amphibian, found in Russia some years ago, with six toes on each foot.


Coates and Clack concluded from the three fossils, the only ones of tetrapods known from such an early period, that when tetrapods first evolved from fish, the number of their toes had not yet been fixed.
