Lakeside center will expand

LAKESIDE — The second phase of construction to expand the Lakeside Community Center at Lindo Lake Park has been approved.

The county Board of Supervisors Ok'd the \$1 million project Tuesday. Funding will come from Community Development Block Grants. Park Lands Dedication Ordinance funds and state sources.

The center, used mostly by seniors, opened in late 1989 and is the only facility of its kind in the unincorporated community of Lakeside. Its 10,000 square feet will be ex-

panded to 15,000 square feet. Bids will go out in September and construction is expected to be completed in February 1992, said Carlos Arias, the county's project manager for Lindo Lake Park.

"We are very pleased. It's been a long way," said Jerry Lester, chairman of Lakeside Community Services, which operates the facility and its programs. "It will benefit the community tremendously. It will be great for teen dances, square dances, you name it."

The first phase of construction included the main multi-purpose room, a kitchen, restrooms and small conference rooms. The next phase will

complete the administrative area, a conference room, and a storage and stage area.

Lester said use of the center averages about 2,000 people a week, from seniors to Brownie troops. The non-profit center charges groups only for maintenance costs. About 50 volunteers staff it.

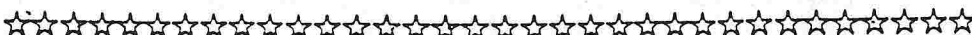
Landscaping will also be included in phase II to enhance the entrance of the center and the view of it from Lindo Lake.

Lester said the county has really improved Lindo Lake Park in the last couple of years. Community Development Block Grant Funds have already been approved to expand parking. (bfs)

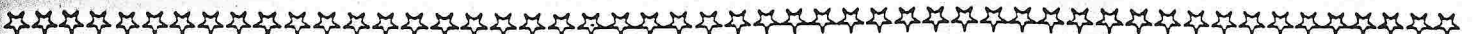

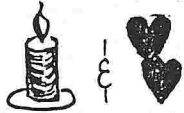

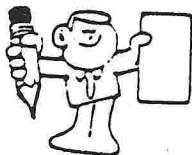

Lakeside Activist
Passes Away

Hazel A. Duling, a 32-year resident of San Diego County died in Solana Beach on June 21, 91. SHE WAS 71 yrs. old.

Mrs. Duling served in the Marine Corps during World War II. She was a member of the Veterans Association and the Women's Marine Association, and was the past Vice Commander of the Women's American Legion for the State of California.

Hazel married Ed Duling in 1953. She has a son, Charles Silvas of Camarillo and two grandchildren, Rob and Michelle.

A resident of Lakeside for the past 21 years, she was very active in community affairs.

She was in the first Lakeside Planning Group formed in 1971, which she served in for 13 years. She served as the county flood commissioner in Zone 2 for four years.

She was on the Lakeside Residents Coalition, a watch-dog group that supported the original adopted community plan and worked at keeping developers and special-interest groups from changing that plan.

Mrs. Duling attended Fire Board and School Board meetings regularly, keeping tabs on their actions.

Friends of the Library and AARP boasted of her membership, as well as the Lakeside Community Services Association which was the service group that spearheaded the drive to build a senior community center in Lindo Park. Most recently she served as a volunteer for the senior lunch program at the Community Center.

Hazel was active in preservationist groups such as the Lakeside Historical Society, the Horseless Carriage Club of America, the San Diego Railroad Museum and the San Diego Antique Bottle and Collectibles Club of which she was the newsletter editor.

Her wish was to have seen young citizens taking a more active role in their community affairs.

Rosary and burial was in her hometown of Visalia, California.

helped battle
Lakeside floods

Lee R. Castleman, 74, a resident of East County throughout his adult life and a community volunteer who was deeply involved in solving Lakeside's flooding problems, died of cancer Monday in his Lakeside home. 7-1-91

Mr. Castleman was born in Mansfield, Wash., and when he was 16 he rode a freight train to San Diego to look for work. He found a job in a Lakeside dairy and remained in that business for several years.

He joined the Navy in 1941. Later, he joined Alco Transportation as a truck driver and retired from that company in 1982. He was a member of Teamsters' Union Local 542.

Mr. Castleman was a member of the Lakeside Planning Group and was involved in the Los Coches Flood Victims Committee, following floods in 1979 and 1980, and he was instrumental in getting the Army Corps of Engineers to build the Lakeside drainage system in 1985 to forestall further flooding.

He was an outdoorsman and a member of the National Rifle Association.

Survivors include his wife, Bette, and a stepdaughter, Dawn Conrad of San Diego.

Eleen M. Anderson, 80, of Lakeside, died Wednesday (June 26, 1991) at Madison Convalescent Home.

A graveside service was scheduled for 11:30 a.m. today at El Camino Memorial Park.

Mrs. Anderson, who was born Oct. 26, 1910, in Virginia City, Nev., lived in the county for 50 years.

She was retired from Teledyne Ryan Aeronautical. For many years, Mrs. Anderson was a Senior Scout leader. She wrote a Senior Scout column for the then-Californian, The Valley News, in the late 1940s.

Survivors include a brother, Fred Frank of El Cajon; two daughters, Janice Hinchliffe of Vista and Claudia Homan of Lakeside; seven grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandchild.
