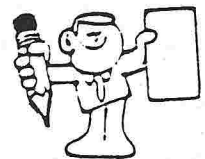

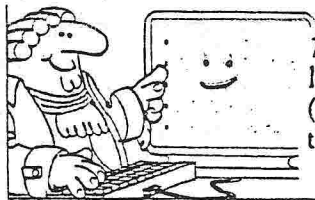

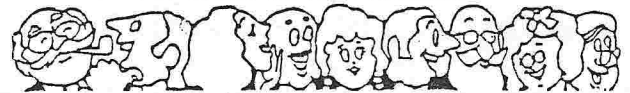

 I am hoping you could help me on my family research about my relative who worked on the San Diego to Lakeside Railroad.

"KARL AUST" BORN - 1 MAY 1843, AUSTRIA  
 DIED - 3 OCT 1920, SAN DIEGO

1870 → 1910 (?) WORKED AND RETIRED AS "MAINTENANCE SUPERINTENDENT" FOR THE RAILROAD LINE.

He lived in San Diego, rode the train line each work day with his repair team and only spoke German, never learning to speak English.

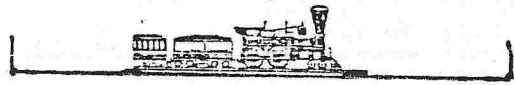

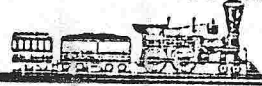

Dear friends,

Just finished reading your May newsletter and as usual enjoyed it very much. I am envious that I can not attend your many meetings and activities as they always sound like so much fun.

My main reason for writing you is to let you know that we are moving to Raleigh, NC the week of June 10th. After 20 years with NCR Corporation (recently acquired by AT&T) my husband took another job with a new company and we are all off to live in the south. We have purchased a new home, which is the house of my dreams, and will be moving right in when we arrive in North Carolina in June.

Raleigh is only two hours from the ocean, 3 hours from the Great Smokie Mountains and has a very mild climate. Except for the humidity, I will almost feel like I am back in San Diego County.

Our new home sits on two acres and we found we were able to get a lot more house for our dollar than we did in Minnesota. Minnesota is a beautiful state, but the cost of living is very high, especially property tax.

I think one has to be born in Minnesota to really appreciate all it has to offer. The natives think nothing of getting out in temperatures below zero, two or three feet of snow, and going on about their business. I have lived here four years and still do not like the cold winters and having to put on five layers of clothes just to walk to the mail box. Almost all the children here learn to skate about the same time they learn to walk and of course High School Hockey is the number one sport. The high school playoffs draw thousands of people and they even close the schools so the kids can attend some of the games. We moved here when my three boys were in their early teens and they felt pretty lost. They all eventually did learn to ski and skate but could never be competitive with kids who have skated their whole life.

I read in you May newsletter that Terri Anderson and Kyle Van Graaff are buying a home in Minnesota. I wish them the best of luck and if they love the outdoor life and winter sports I know they will be very happy here.

I am enclosing with this letter a Pictorial of Lindo Park School 1952-53 for your historical library. I also have one from Lakeside Jr. High and will forward that when I find it. I apologize for the pictures that are cut out. When I was in elementary school it was fashionable to cut out pictures of your friends and carry them in your wallet. Of course I could now kick myself in the you know what for cutting out those pictures.

One final note, I read in your April newsletter of the passing away of Katie Maniscalco. When I was growing up in Lakeside, Katy and Sam were some of my best friends. They had the best penny candy in the neighborhood and also the best selection of movie magazines. I was a frequent customer and they always had a smile and a kind word for me. Our family had a Friday night ritual which consisted of a shrimp dinner at Cecil's and then a stop of at Katy and Sams where my parents picked up their adult beverages and I got to pick out any kind of pop I wanted. Such a simple life, but we were so happy. I am sure Katy and Sam are both missed.

I will write again after we move and tell you all about North Carolina. If any other members live in NC I would love to hear from them. Have you ever published a name and address list of all members?
