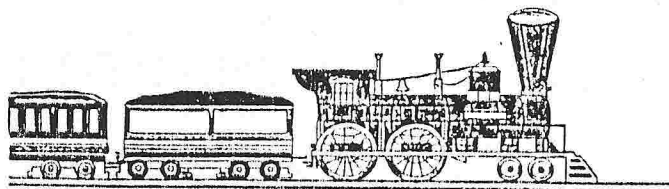


MAY '91

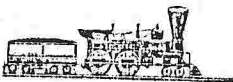
OUR MEMBER (AKA AS ONE OF OUR FAVORITE POST OFFICE CLERKS) :

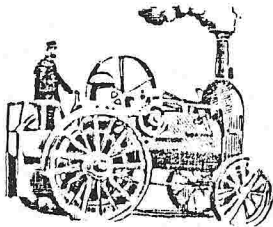

COOKIN' IN THE BACK COUNTRY

Here's How You Can
Recycle Newspapers To
Make Reuseable Newsprint!

Kids: This recipe calls for a small amount of
bleach. Please have an adult help you.

1. Cut or tear old newspaper pages into bits about 1" or 1 1/2" in size. Black and white pages work best for this recipe.
2. Place bits of paper into a plastic bucket. In a separate container, mix water and approximately 1/2 cup bleach. The more bleach you use, the whiter your paper will be. Slowly add the water mixture to the paper, stirring as you go. Stop when the consistency is similar to papier-mache.
3. Allow mixture to soak for about 30 minutes. Add more water-bleach mixture if the paper has gotten too thick.
4. Spread the paper-water mixture out on wax paper or foil into a thin, even layer. Use rolling pins coated with oil to make the surface smooth and even-if you desire.
5. Allow to dry completely. Paper is ready to be written on or used for art projects.

Like all recipes, sometimes practice makes perfect!
Getting the right consistency before drying is very important to the success of this science project.

Dinosaur fossils discovered on mountain in Antarctica

Scientists examining ancient deposits of volcanic ash on an Antarctic mountain have uncovered the bones of a dinosaur dating back 200 million years. The fossilized bones of the animal, believed to be a plant-eating dinosaur 25 to 30 feet long, were discovered by David Elliot, professor of geological sciences at Ohio State University. Elliot found the fossils, including rib bones, vertebrae and perhaps part of the skull, on a patch of snow-free rock 12,500 feet up the side of Mount Kirkpatrick, the highest peak in the Transantarctic range.

Also found was a large tooth, about 1 1/2 inches long, believed to be from a flesh-eating dinosaur. These are the first dinosaur remains ever found in the interior of the Antarctic continent.
