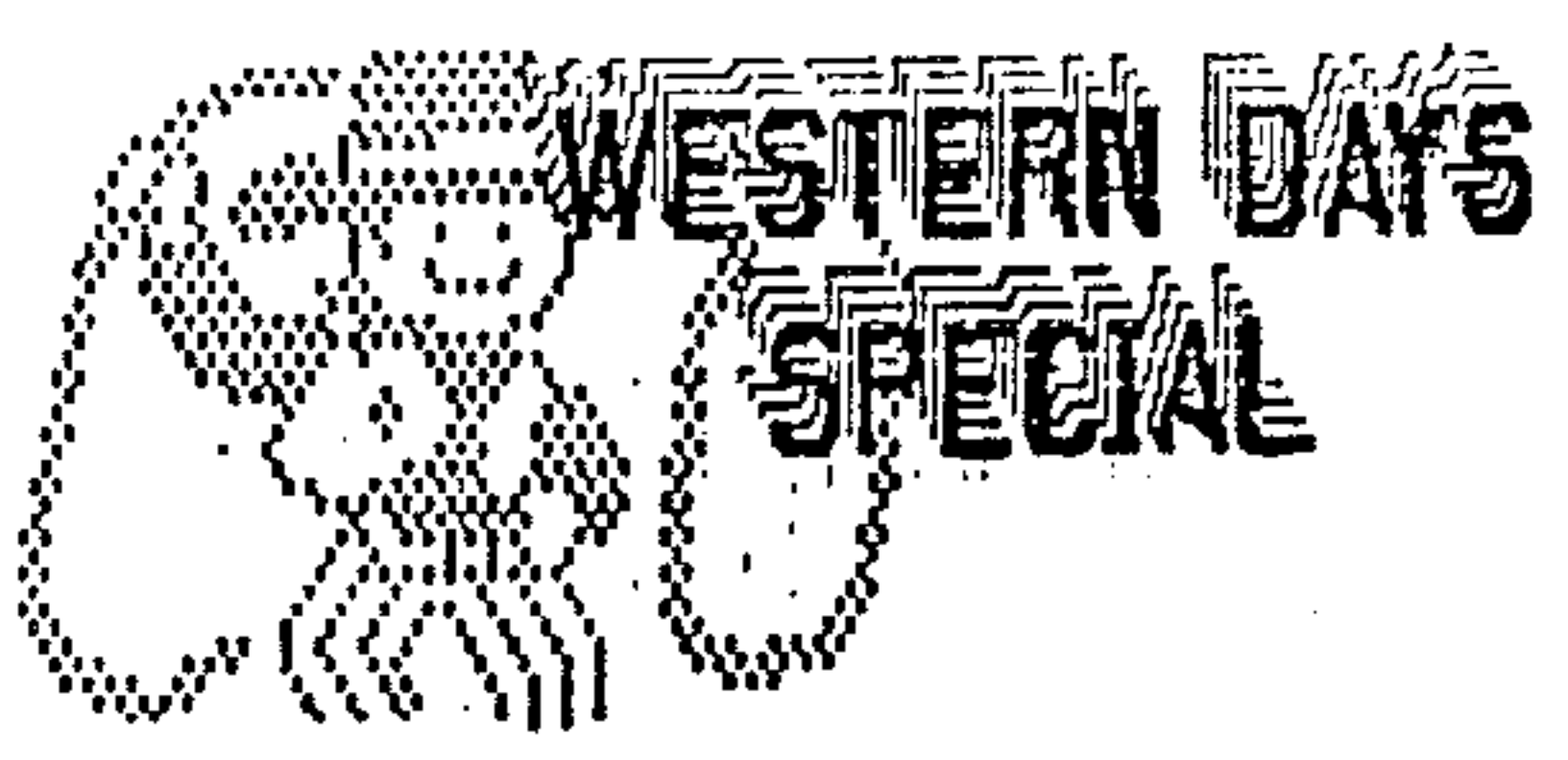
There are 8 of the original (1886) chairs in need of repair. How about 8 of you members each taking one and making it usable ?

Park closure dates set

4-13.92 San Diego

The recession has hit recreation and forced the closure of three county parks three days a week until further notice.

Eleven parks will be closed on three select dates to allow staff members to take time off without pay and reduce overhead costs.

"Desperate times require desperate measures," said Robert Copper, director of the county Parks and Recreation Department. "We are forced to make hard decisions."

Beginning April 21, Felicita Park in Escondido, San Dieguito Park in Solana Beach and El Monte Park in Lakeside will close Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays to allow for additional staffing on weekends.

Eleven parks will be closed April 22, May 15 and June 15. They are Felicita, San Dieguito, El Monte, Flinn Springs Park, Lindo Lake Park in Lakeside, Live Oak Park in Fallbrook; Los Peñasquitos Adobe and Staging Area in San Diego, Louis A. Stelzer Park in Lakeside, Pine Valley Park, Quail Gardens in Encinitas and San Elijo Lagoon in Encinitas.

In addition, the department's administrative offices at 5201 Ruffin Road, Suite P, will close one day a month to allow the staff to take time off. The closure dates are April 15, May 15 and June 15.

April 15 — this Wednesday — is normally the first day reservations can be made at parks for the Fourth of July weekend. Those wishing to do so are asked to visit the department Thursday instead.

Dear Sir:

Enclosed you will find some photos I took on Feb. 18 when I visited Lakeside with Dr. Caroline Bauer, who lives there. My father George J. Adams was pastor at the Presbyterian Church in the mid-1940s (1942-46) after returning from Korea, where he was a missionary in Andong prior to WW-II. We returned to Korea in 1949 and evacuated at the beginning of the Korean War. I finished up my high school education in Japan with a DOD school and returned to Whitworth College for my undergraduate work.

I attended the elementary school (which I believe is now the Middle School) from 3rd grade through sixth grade. My younger brother, George, Don and Jon (who was pre-school) along with my mother Margaret made up the family. My mother passed away last year May, having retired in Westminster Garden, Duarte, Calif. My father, George, is still living in Texas, having remarried. His address is: 1100 Crossbend Crt. Irving, Texas, 75061. He is still in the ministry but is planning to retire this September. He is 86.

If you are interested I can go through some of my collected photos of this period and send you copies. We lived in the manse next door to the church. There was an arbor porch in front of the house and the garage is gone. The backyard of the manse has been filled in with additional buildings connected to the church and the large tree is gone (which held a two story tree house that I built). I assume that the owls in the bell tower are also no longer there. My job was to ring the bell each Sunday.

Probably my closest friend was Dick Pasco, who with his brother Bobby were taken care of by Mrs Frances Desmond. She became Dick and Bobby's foster parents as the father was a drunk and could not take care of the boys. Dick is now a two-star general in the Air Force. His brother Bobby was killed in an auto accident. Is Mrs Desmond still living? I would certainly like to hear from her.

Another family we knew quite well were Harold and Grace Blair. Harold was a teacher and died quite awhile ago, Grace died several years ago but one of her daughters now lives in San Diego (Mary Blair Wescott) 7234 Arillo St. The once lived in the orchard areas above Lakeside. I often helped on their farm. The dirt road into the area was used as a dump and I would collect old license plates. (this collection is now lost in Korea) With two large pepper trees in the yard, the house they lived in was supposedly haunted. (so the story goes)

Another family we knew quite well, who were good members of the church were the Dunhams. I worked one summer on their chicken ranch. I understand that Hart is still living in Lakeside. I remember they had a family of daughters that bothered me most of the time as they were much younger. They used to laugh that my Dad had four sons and Hart had four daughters and we were all good friends. Their farm was across from the Price Ranch where we went for camping experiences. The Blair's youngest daughter, Kay, died of polio, during the summer after sixth grade. We were the same age and good friends and this really affected me.



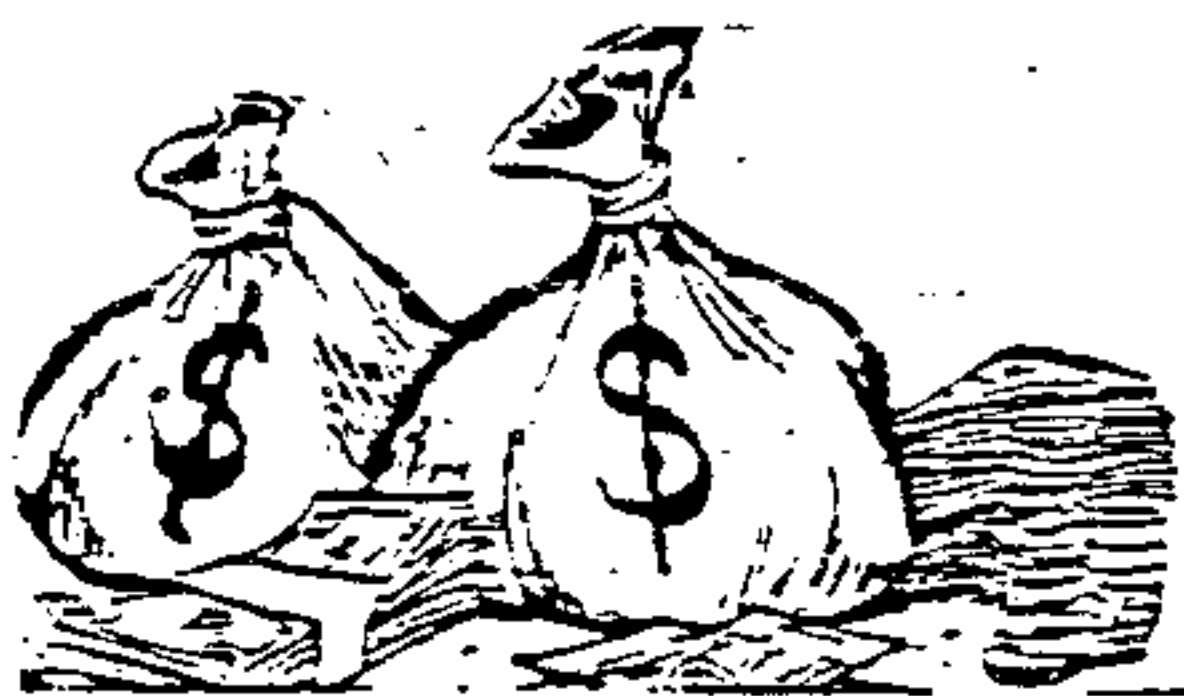
What ever happened to the Carlile family. I noticed their home is now a funeral home. I remember playing quite abit with Mary but the brother was older and don't really remember him. Is her whereabouts known? She probably would remember the four pesky boys from across the street and the good Doctor was not too happy about this association. I remember she had a large, beautiful playhouse in their backyard.

I was born in Taegu, Korea in 1934 and after obtain my Masters in Educ. Administration from Eastern Washington University, I went to Asia to serve with the Department of Defense Schools from 1959 to 1973 in Taiwan, Japan and Korea. In 1973 I established the Seoul International School which now has an enrollment of 750 students grades K-12. We have over 45 different nationalities and serve as a college preparatory school accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges out of Burlington, Calif.

I am presently on sabbatical in Albuquerque, NM. I have enclosed a copy of our school brochure. I am a writer and photographer having written over 15 photographic books about Korea, its culture and history. Ten of these books have been children's tales about Korea. I'll send you a copy of our school calendar. I wish you the best as your historical society flourishes

LOTTIE LUTON HEISE

Mr. and Mrs. Luton came from Kansas and settled on a farm in El Monte Valley in 1906. It was here their two daughters were born, Lottie and Esther. The girls attended the local schools. Lottie met her husband, Kermit, during the war and they were married in 1944. In 1945, Lottie ran the Bide-a-Wee Cafe on Main St. and later worked at Cecil's Restaurant for 23 years. She was a very talented person, sharing her talents with many other people. Her crafts included leather work, "rock hounding" - cutting, polishing and making jewelry. She taught many young girls the art of knitting. She was a giving person. She died March 22, 1992 after a courageous battle against cancer. Besides her husband, she leaves a sister, Esther Mize, of San Diego and nieces and nephews.

Charley Kanady died April 14th at a convalescent hospital in El Cajon after a lengthy illness. Charley's family moved to Lakeside about 1913. He was an avid hunter and fisherman. He was a member of the Lakeside Sportsman's Club from its inception and a Life Member of the Lakeside Historical Society...Besides his wife Helen, he leaves his son Russell (Hawaii) and daughter Velmalyn (Corona) 6 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren and a sister-Myrtle Kanady Goodman of Lakeside.
