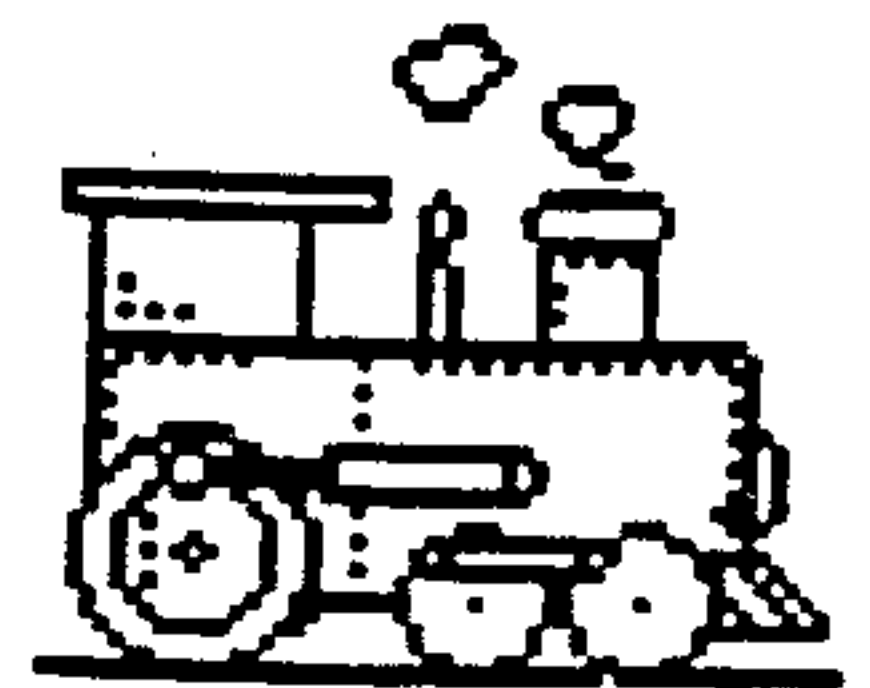
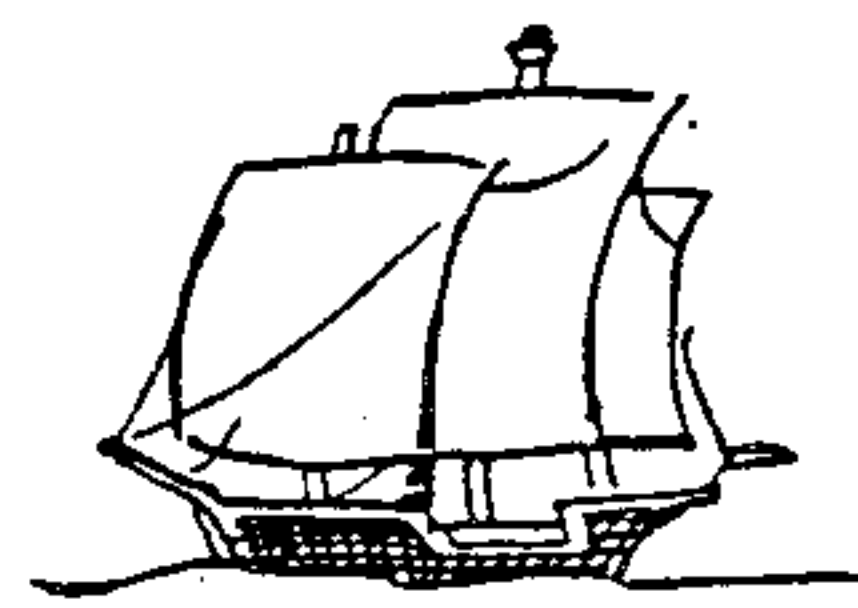
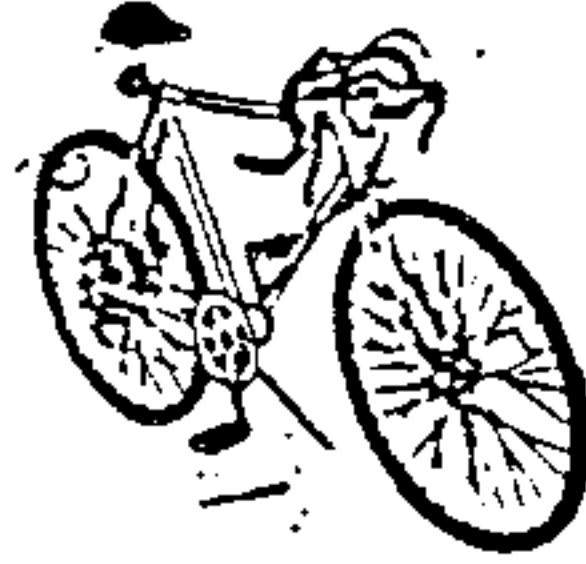
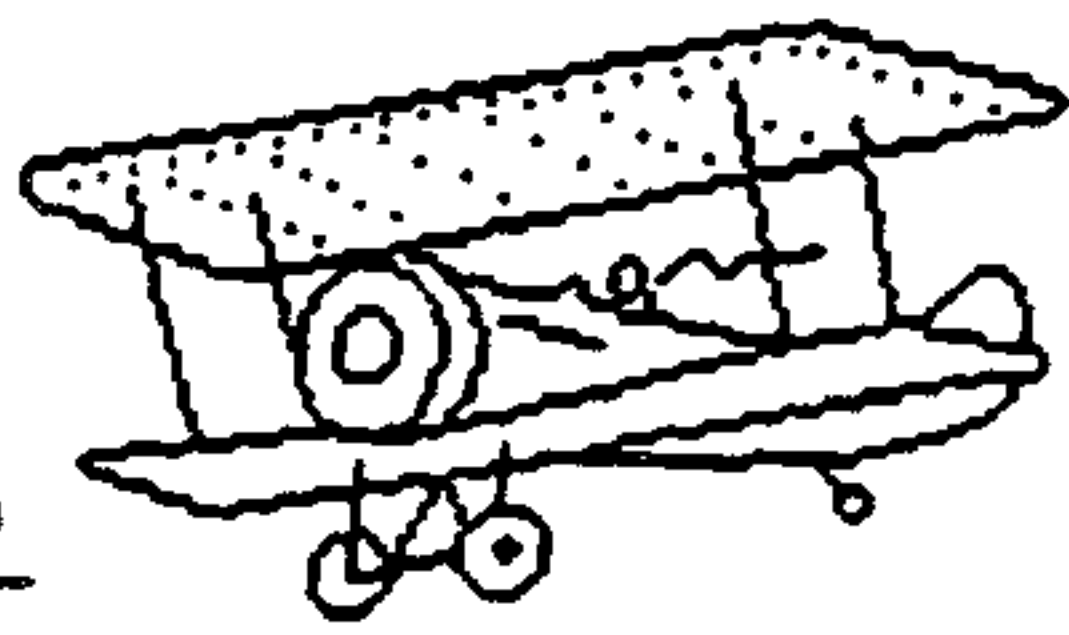
OLGA PUHN is getting around just fine, after a nasty fall, with the aid of a walker . . . but the walker is "only temporary" she says with great determination.

LEDA HARTUNG DUNLAP died August 31, 1993. She was born Jan. 1, 1907 in San Diego and moved to Lakeside when she was eight years old with her parents, OTTO & EMMA HARTUNG, a sister, RUTH & brother ED. WALTER, the oldest brother, was already working in Lakeside for his aunt & uncle, LEDA & CHARLES COLE. The HARTUNGS brought their bakery business from San Diego to the bakery on Lakeshore (now a Taco Shop) and built the brick oven in back of the bakery. They sold the bakery to the DENT's and later moved back to San Diego. After LEDA's marriage, she and her husband moved to Lemon Grove. She was active in the Native Daughters of the Golden West Pioneer Society of San Diego, a Life Member of the Lakeside Historical Society, Royal Neighbors of America, and Villa View Hospital Auxiliaries. Services were held at St. John of the Cross Catholic Church in Lemon Grove. Survivors include her step-daughter, PAT DAWSON of Texas; brother ED of Red Bluff, CA; and three generations of

nieces and nephews. The family suggests any donations be made in her memory to the charity of donor's choice.

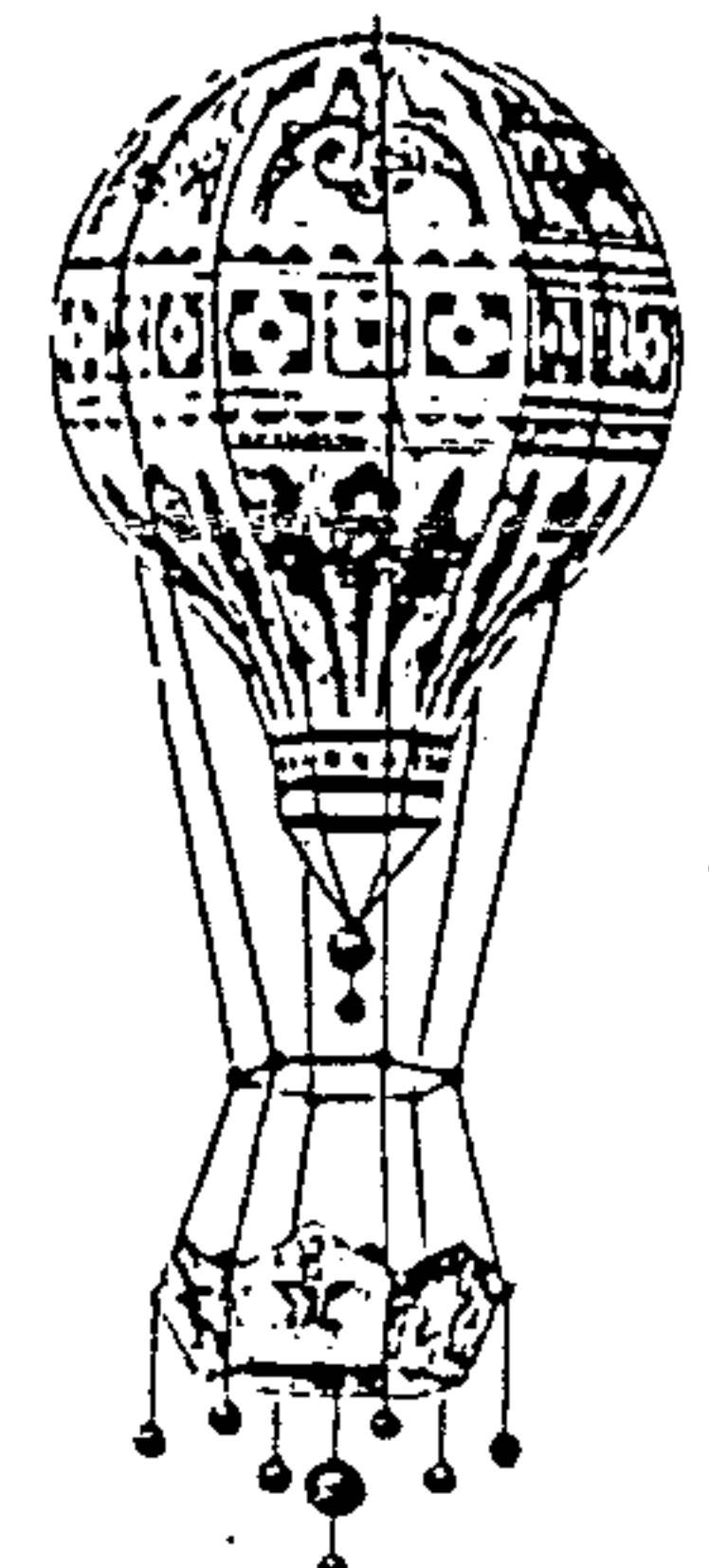

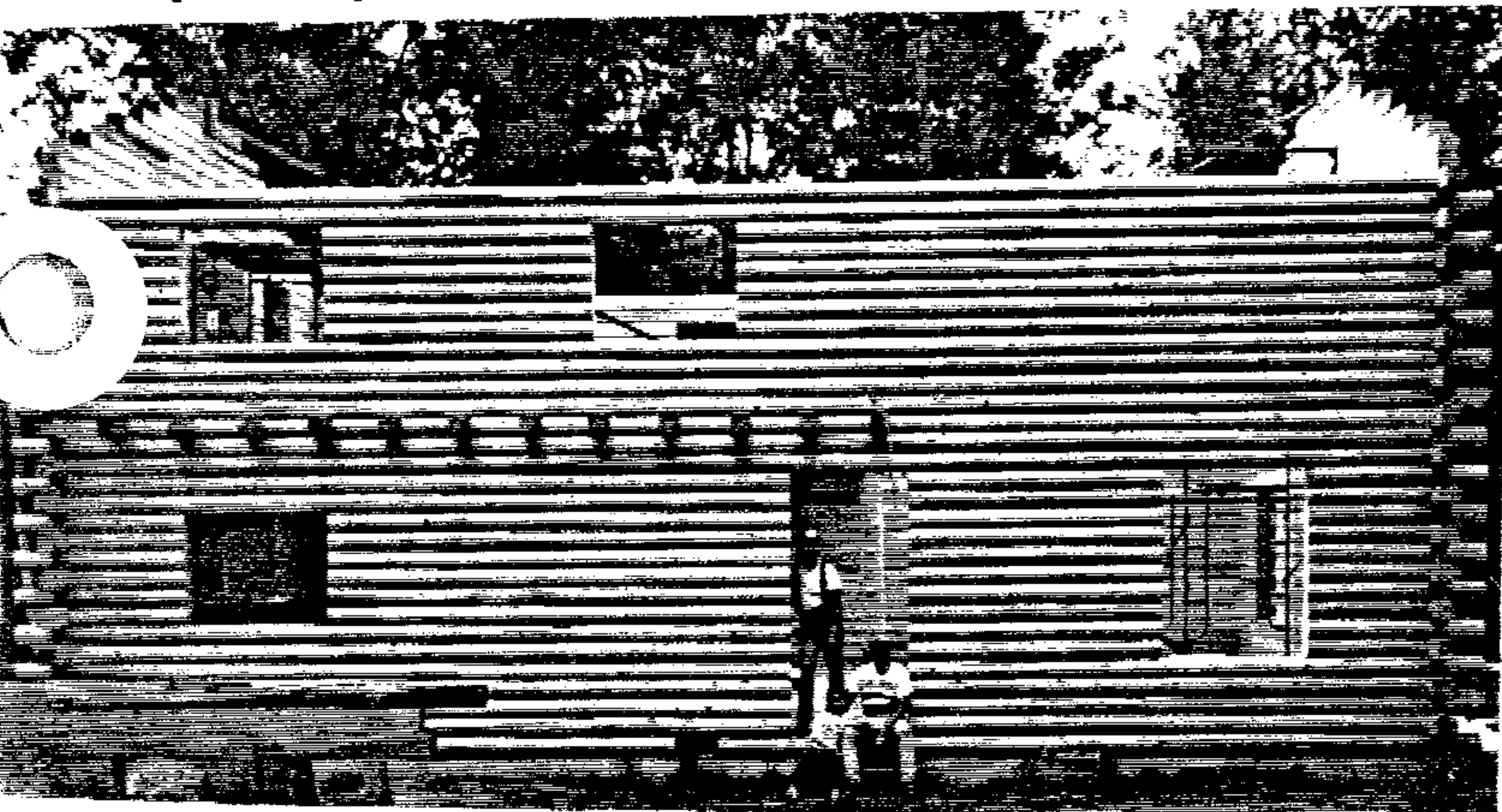

Can change come to our Lakeside without compromise? Lots of face lifting and activity going on on Maine Avenue. RICK SMITH, Lakeside Chamber of Commerce president said "There will be a tremendous struggle to balance the need for economic growth, and the desire for rural character."

Lakeside Middle School will soon get a \$1.4 million facelift thanks to some persistent administrators and intervention by local assemblymen. The school was built in 1939 and is the fourth school and the first middle school in the Lakeside district to undergo modernization. Nine portable classrooms to be located on the outside of the campus will house some of the students while construction is in progress. Possible improvements include upgrading the heating, cooling and electrical systems, window casings, etc.

JOHN MULREAN, owner of Three Llama Hill Ranch in Lakeside, says his greatest pleasure is taking his pet llamas into a

children's center or senior rest home. The animals sense they must be extra still and quiet and carefully walk between the beds and around the patients. Most evenings, Mulrean and a helper can be seen taking the three llamas for a trek around Lindo Lake Park.

MARINA BENAVENTE, Program Director of The Lakeside Boys & Girls Club, has lots of enthusiasm and states "it is a positive place for kids - it's a club that beats the streets." The club hosts a wide range of programs and projects that provide a sorely needed service for young people aged 6 through 18 who have nothing constructive to do after school lets out each day.

EL MONTE REGIONAL PARK, after being closed mid-week since April of 1992 because of staff shortages, has returned to seven-day-a-week operation.

WAL-MART Stores Inc., is considering plans to open its' second store in East County. Slated for a vacant 40-acre parcel south of Interstate 8 near Los Cochos Road, Wal Mart officials are convinced that the unincorporated community of 51,000 people is ready for such a store.

EL CAPITAN HIGH SCHOOL had an estimated crowd of 2,000 attending the Heartland Swim Association's Summer Swim League Championships. STEVE TUCKER, coordinator, said "we have 120 more swimming than last year, we're really cramped. . .it's our biggest summer ever. . .we had 19 coaches at eight pools." Using a point system, the GROSSMONT swim team finished FIRST Saturday to take the team championship, with EL CAJON VALLEY and MONTE VISTA placing second and third, respectively.

The Santee-Lakeside POP WARNER teams were suited up and ready for a series of exhibition games which are one of several ways the league hopes to raise funds for the season which opened September 11th.

On a recent back roads auto trip thru CA; OR; ID; & MT; daughter VIRGINIA EMBRY and EDNA enjoyed beautiful country historical areas and visited with several of our historical members. We visited WES & DONNA, and JOHN KOUNS in Kalispell, MT; CHARLES & JOAN KOUNS in Klamath, CA; the JOHNSON "boys" in Chico & Healdsburg, CA. DAVID, TOM & BOB (sons of RUSSELL & ISABELLE) will be remembered by many of you. They each sent their greeting and look forward to a visit to Lakeside, their home for many years.



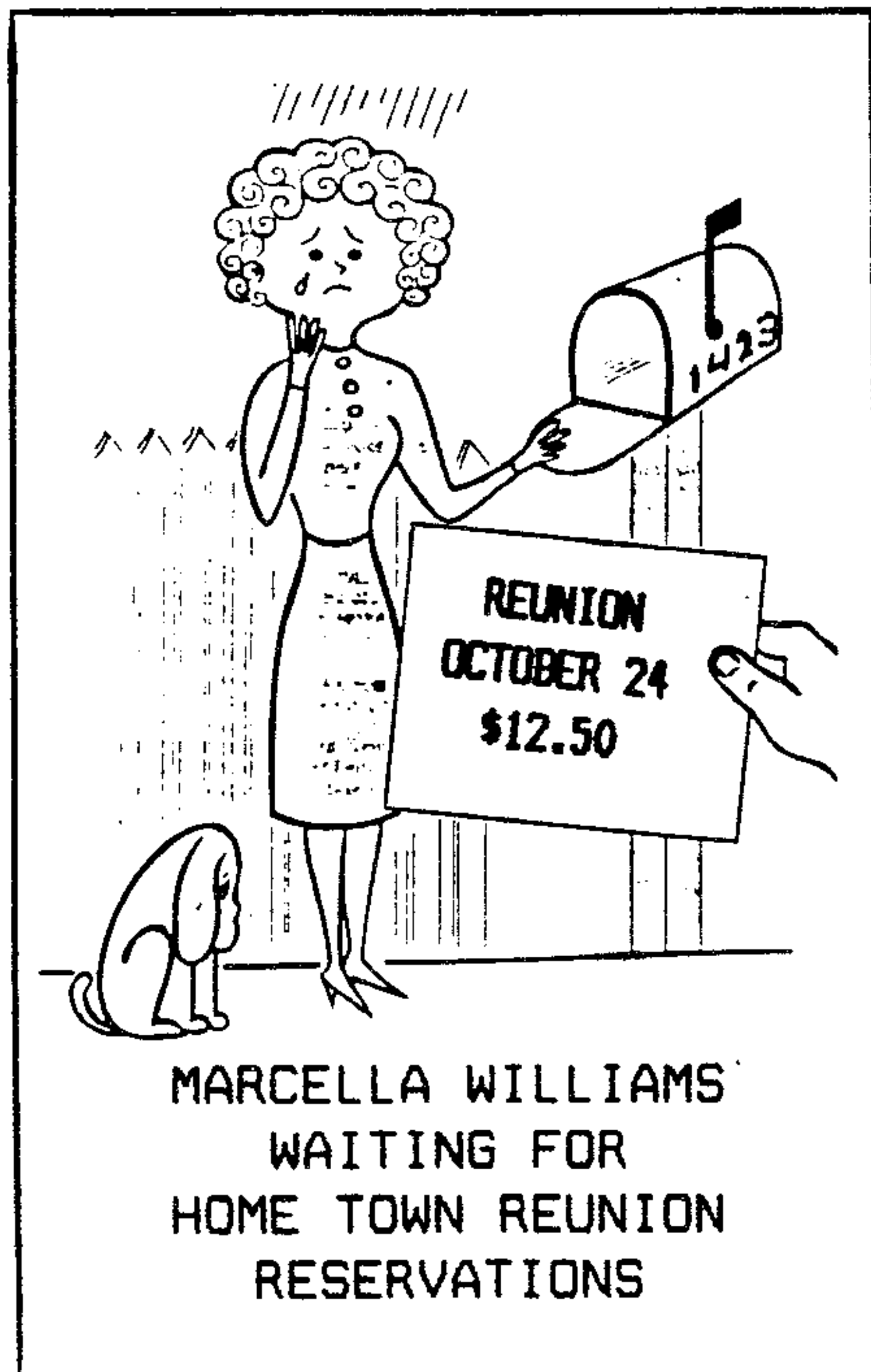
