President's Message

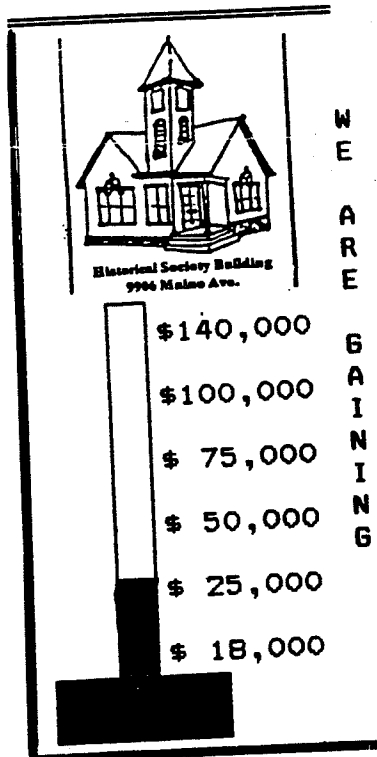

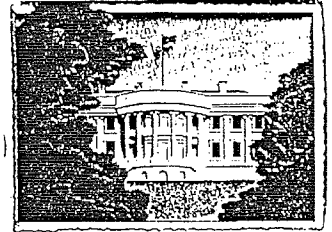
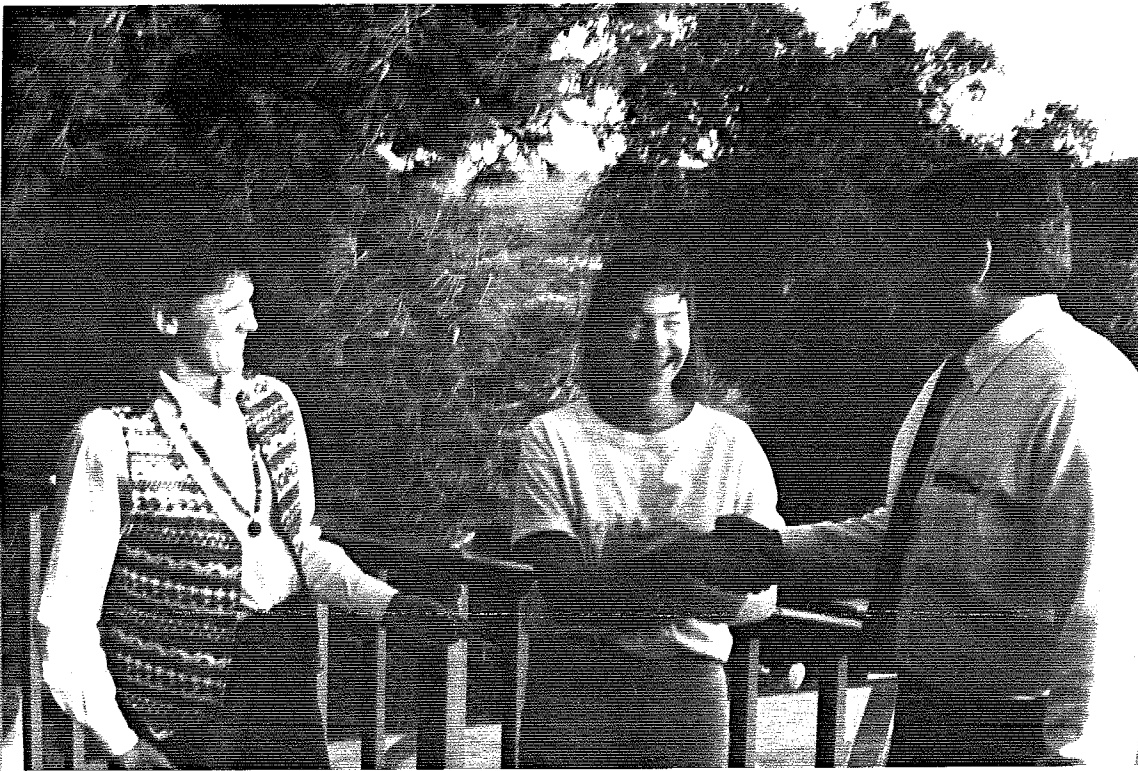

BORN BEFORE 1945???

We are the survivors! Consider the changes we have witnessed. We were born before television, penicillin, Polio shots, frozen foods, xerox, plastic, contact lenses, frisbees and the pill, split atoms, and ball point pens; Before drip dry clothes, and before man walked on the moon. We got married first, then lived together. How quaint can we be? In our time a closet was something to put our clothes in, not to come out of!, & gay meant happy. Bunnies were small rabbits and rabbits were not Volkswagens, and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along with our cousins. We thought fast food was what you ate over Lent and outer space was the back row of the local drive-in theater. We were before house husbands, gay rights, computer dating, dual careers and computer marriages. We were before day-care centers, group therapy and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radio, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt and gays wearing earrings. For us time share meant togetherness, not computers or condominiums; a chip was a piece of wood. Hardware and soft wear was not even a word. In 1940 made in Japan meant junk! And "MAKING OUT" referred to how you did on your exam. Pizzas, McDonalds's and instant coffee were unheard of. In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was mowed, and cold drink, and pot was something you cooked in. Rock music was grandmas lullaby and aids were helpers in the principals office. We hit the scene when there were 5 and Dime stores where you could buy things for 5 or 10 cents. For a nickel you could ride the street car, make a phone call, buy a pepsi, or enough stamps to mail a letter and two post cards. You could buy a new Chev coupe for \$600, but who could afford one? A pity too, for gas was only 11 cents per gal. We were certainly not before the difference in the sexes was discovered, but we were surely before sex changes. We made do with what we had and we were the last generation that was so dumb to think you needed a husband to have a baby. No wonder we were so confused as that there is such a generation gap!, but we survived.

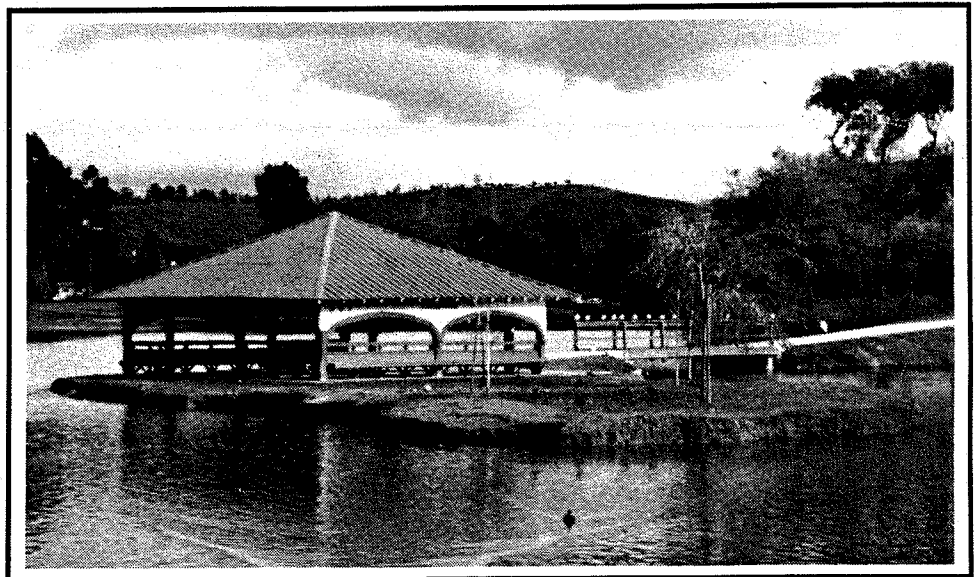
