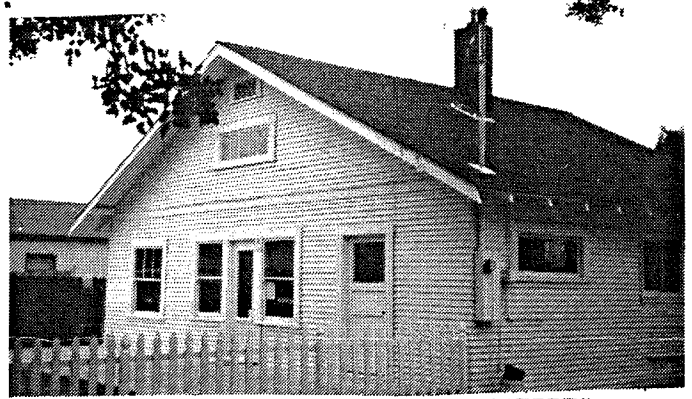


President's Message

In Memoriam



TRIBUTE TO A FRIEND - RACHEL GIBSON (better known as "PINKIE") died May 31 in the Magnolia Convalescent home in El Cajon, where her husband, GAVIN now resides. Many of you will remember the GEORGE GIBSON's who had a chicken ranch on Vista Camino in the early 1900's. Their biography can be found in the Legend's of Lakeside. The ALICE GIBSON Circle at the Community Presbyterian Church was named for her. RACHEL was a member of the TNT (Thread, Needle & Thimble) Club. *by Marcella Williams*

MASON PINNICK, 85. Mason, a county resident for 50 years, was born in Hymer, Kansas. He and MARIE were married in 1931 and lived in Lakeside 44 years. Mason was a Pearl Harbor Survivor serving aboard the USS Minneapolis when she was torpedoed and nearly sank at the battle of Coral Sea. Besides his wife, survivors are 2 sons, BILL of LaJolla and MIKE of Oceanside; 6 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren, 1 sister and 2 brothers.

SEVA HOOPER, 87, died Saturday May 20, 1995. SEVA was born in New York. Survivors include her daughters, ALMA MORERO of Ramona and JOAN PERRY of Kentucky; stepdaughter RUTH OBERST of New York; 6 grandchildren; 22 great grandchildren and 7 great-great-grandchildren. SEVA was a member of the Lakeside Historical Society.

JAMES DOUGLAS McClAIN, 65. We were saddened to hear of the death of JIMMY McClAIN on May 31, 1995 in Flagstaff, Arizona where he resided. Services were held at the First

Baptist Church in Williams, Arizona on June 5th. He was born October 27, 1929 to DOUGLAS & FANNY McClAIN in San Diego, He spent his early years in Lakeside, graduating from Grossmont High School. He moved to Arizona in 1960 to help on his father's cattle ranch. JIMMY is survived by his wife, NONA and 8 children: RUBY ARMSTRONG of New Mexico; DOUG McClAIN; JAMES McClAIN; JASON McClAIN; LINDA WYROSTIC; and ROSALIN KIRK, all of Arizona; DONNA KERTMAN of Dana Point, CA; STEPHEN RACHER of PA; father DOUGLAS McClAIN; sisters, BETTY CARR of Kamiah, ID. and MARJORIE REEVES of Rancho Santa Fe, CA.

DAVID B. MARTIN, 67. He was the founder of Dave Martin Supplies in Lakeside. He died June 13th at his summer home in Minneapolis after a long illness. He was a Grossmont High School graduate who was raised on the Martin Dairy Ranch in Santee. He was honored as Lakeside's Man of the Year in 1987 for his dedication to many local organizations including the Boys & Girls Club; The Home of Guiding Hands; the Lakeside Historical Society and many others. He is survived by his wife JANET; his sons WILLIAM of Jamul; DANIEL of El Cajon; and ROBERT of Alpine and 4 daughters - SUSAN GREENBERG of Poway; LINDA NOYAS of Lakeside; JEANNIE MALLONE of Lakeside and NANCY MARTIN of Oakland and 25 grandchildren. 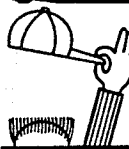

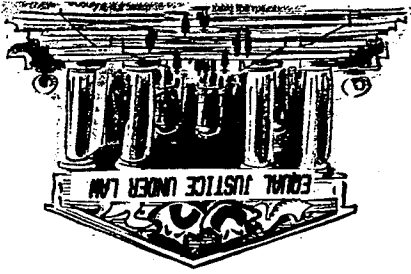

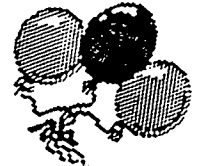
