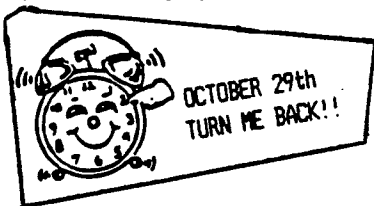

KENNETH GOODMAN, 85, died September 20th after a lengthy illness. A private memorial service was held. He was born December 25, 1911 in Ohio. He was an attorney and also worked at Ryan for 25 years. Much could be said about KEN and his devotion to youth of this area. He spent many years working with Lakeside/Santee Pony League.

Survivors include his wife of 55 years, ANNA, who is a long time member of the Historical Society and who is one we call on to play our old organ in the church; a son, BILL; three daughters, KAY ANDERSON; JANET AUBLE and BARBARA SPRINGER.

JACQUELINE TOMLINSON, 75, died Monday, October 2nd at Grossmont Hospital. She had managed Leio's Pharmacy for 15 years and owned and operated a Board & Care Home for disabled women for 20 years. She was a member of the Pharmacy Club and had received an award for volunteer hours with the Santee Police Station. JACKIE is the 43rd person to join the Lakeside Historical Society as a Life Member in 1982 and has been a loyal supporter since that time. She is survived by two sons, SONNY and PAUL and a daughter, JOANN GORSICA.

MARTY DUNHAM MARSHALL (Martha Lee) was born October 1942. She was 2 years old when the family bought a chicken ranch on Palm Row Drive in Lakeside. Her early years were spent actively in school activities, church

involvement and acquiring many lasting friendships. MARTY graduated from El Capitan High School in 1963, married DAVID MARSHALL and they were later divorced. Two children were born of this union. MARTY developed muscular sclerosis and even after many hard years of suffering, it never destroyed her beautiful spirit.

Survivors include a son, TIM and a daughter SARAH; a grandson, ANTHONY; three sisters: MARY JAY, SAMMIE and GERRI. Following her death October 1st, 1995, services were held in Berkeley, California.

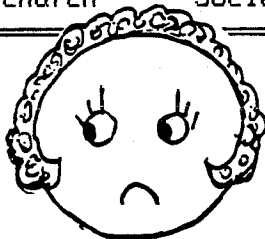

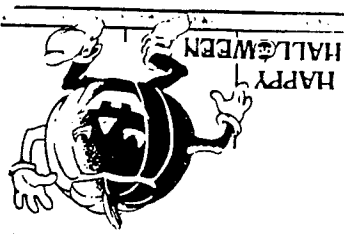

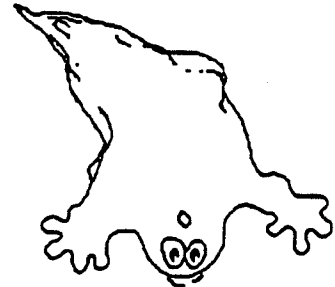
