Too much going on - - - April 15th, Taxes, Taxes, Taxes! The report will be all together for our next issue.

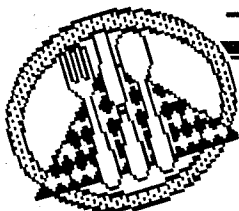
March has been a great month for the Society with all the accomplishments and celebrations. We are still working to pay down the mortgage. . . keep up the good work!

There was not a vacant seat **Sunday, March 24th** when a Centennial celebration to re-dedicate the Historic Olde Community Church - - home of the Lakeside Historical Society took place.

There were Proclamations from the County of San Diego, State of California and our President, Bill Clinton. Two proclamations; the WHITE HOUSE and COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO have been retyped and share page 8. A copy of the proclamation from the State of California can be seen on page 9.

A plaque was given by JEAN and BOB ANGUS which has been retyped and can be seen just below on the right. This plaque will be placed in the front of our building.

The Centennial Quilt with 122 names was unveiled - - it is GRAND and we certainly appreciate JUDY PUHN HOOPER, BARBARA and OLGA who made it possible.

Much history was learned from appropriately dressed women of the past who played a big part in the growth of Lakeside portrayed by OLGA PUHN, PAT ELLWOOD, VIRGINIA McGUINNESS and ELAINE BRACK.

This Memorial Tablet

Commemorates the inauguration of the Victory Bell Movement, during the World War, in the Presbyterian Church of Lakeside, California, when at noon, on April 25, 1918, in the presence of five hundred delegates from the Woman's Club of San Diego County the first Victory Bell was rung by Mrs. Eleanor B. Parkes, originator of the movement, the bell being struck seven times, spelling the word V-I-C-T-O-R-Y, followed by a moment of silent prayer.

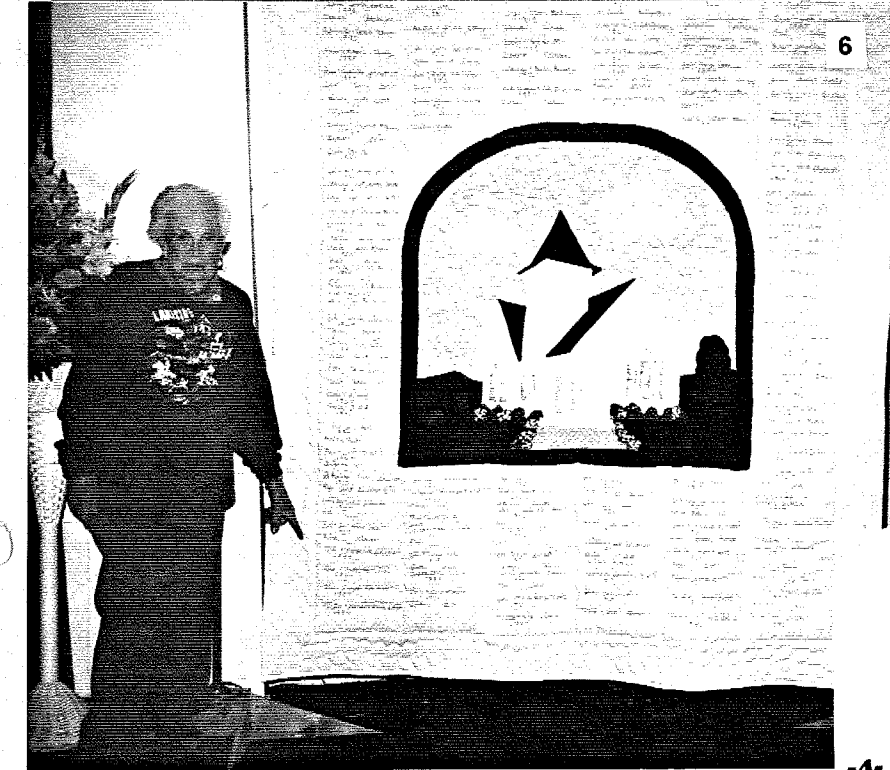
On May 23, 1918 the General Assembly, at Columbus, Ohio adopted a resolution present by the Rev. Samuel C. Gilman, a Commissioner from the Los Angeles Presbytery and Minister of the Lakeside Church, endorsing the movement and recommending that the Presbyterian Churches throughout the United States ring the church bells at the noon hour, and prayer be offered for victory and a righteous peace for our Country, the President of the United States, the American Soldiers, and the triumph of American and Allied Arms.

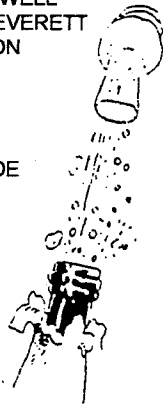

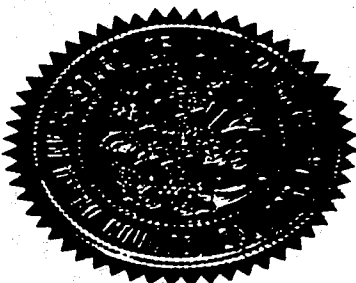
WHEREAS, in 1986, the Lakeside Historical Society decided to restore and beautify this historic church, investing \$400,000 in times, labor and materials; and

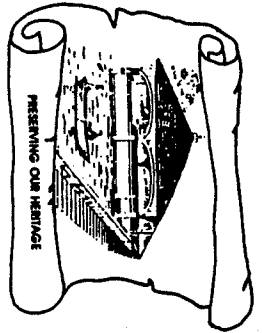

A STORY OF DEVELOPMENT
1896 - 1996

- 1893 - The First Presbyterian Church of Lakeside was organized with 13 charter members. Worship services were conducted on the porch of Lakeside Inn, a well appointed resort facility which was located where the Lakeside Post Office now stands.
- 1895 - Construction begun on the Sanctuary which still stands at Park and Maine streets. Congregation then consisted of 30 members.
- 1896 - First service in the new Sanctuary. (February 9)
Among the exhibits is an original copy of the special music program which was presented March 29, 1896 as a part of the dedication ceremonies.
- 1914 - Sunday Church school wing added to north side of the Sanctuary. From 1914-1953 it was a social hall on week-days and housed the Sunday Church school on Sundays. After 1951 it became an extension of the Sanctuary.
- 1946 - Surplus army barracks added. This was known as "the annex". It served primarily as Sunday quarters for the Kindergarten department, and later housing for week-day pre-school.
- 1953 - Week-day Pre-school formed with six children enrolled in the Sunday School wing. This wing is now the Historical Society store and archives.
- 1963 - The last worship service held in the Maine Avenue building.
- 1963 - The Pine Hills Retreat Thrift Shop ran continuously until 1986.
- 1965 - The Open Door for Dialogue and the Pink Pole also were housed in the buildings.
- 1986 - Lakeside Historical Society signed the lease with the Lakeside Community Presbyterian Church and began the restoration program.
- 1992 - County Board of Supervisors voted the Olde Community Church a County Historical Landmark.
- 1993 - Memorial Garden was dedicated.
- 1994 - The Lakeside Historical Society purchased the Olde Community Church.
- 1995 - The beginning of the Centennial Celebration with the Home Town Reunion in October.
- 1996 - February 11th was a worship service to celebrate the 100 years ago when the building had its first worship service.
- 1996 - March 24 - The rededication Anniversary of the building.

He so loved the Olde Church and was so pleased that you took it over and made such a beautiful renovation. It seems very fitting that his last public function was within its walls.

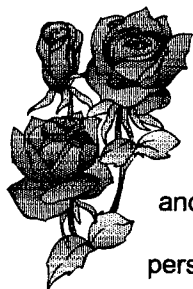
For me personally, for his family, and for the community, his death leaves a large hole in our lives. But the good memories are waiting to erase the grief in time.

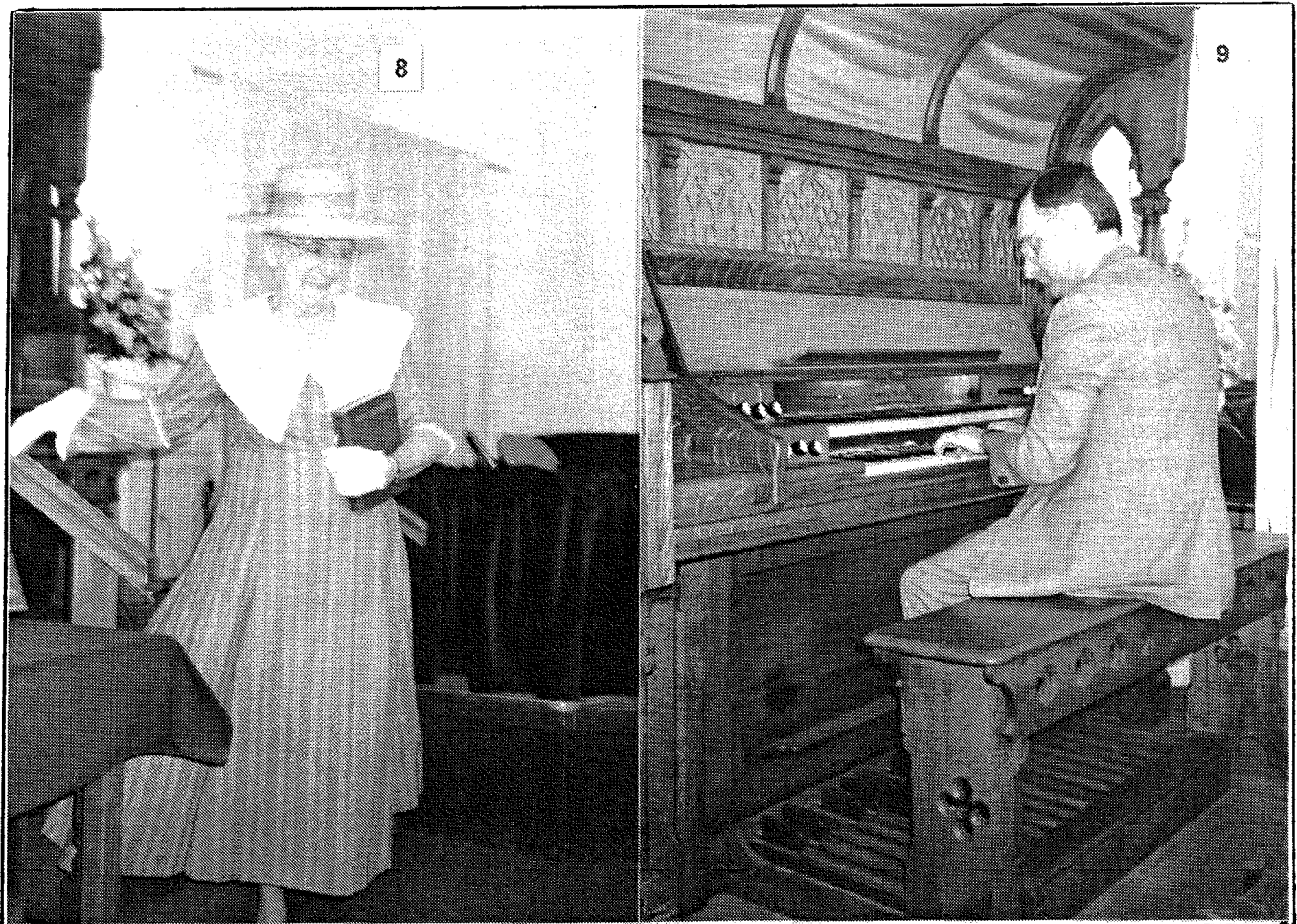
Centennial Wrap-up

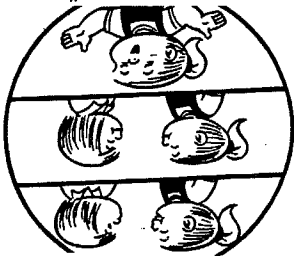

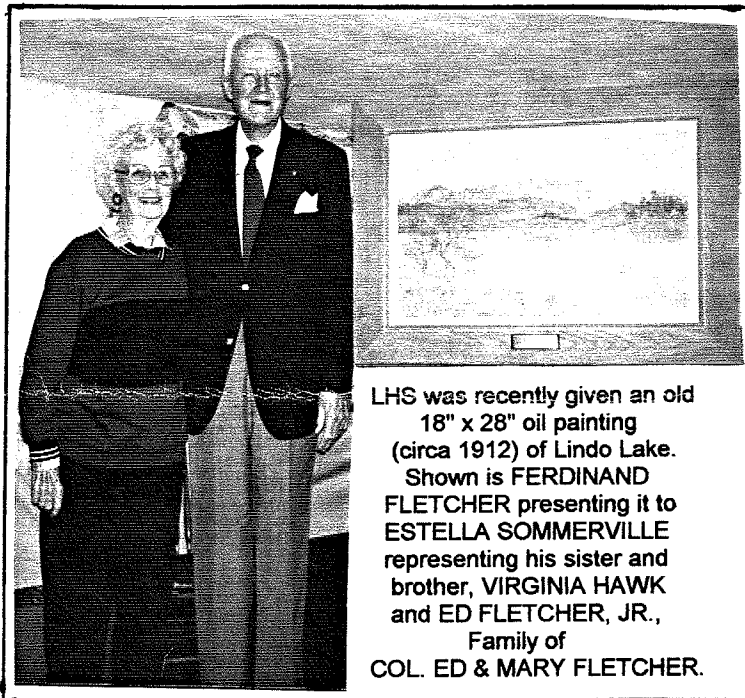
