This month I have been asked to tell you a little about an organization of which we as Lakeside Historical Society are a member.

That organization is the **Conference of California Historical Societies**. It was formed in 1953 as a means to bring together the many historical societies and museums throughout the State to share their common needs and expertise, and to bind them together in the interest of history in California. Members have endeavored to find ways of helping and informing each other of problems which often can be solved better by group efforts.

Meetings are held in various locations. The Annual Meeting in June alternates between northern and southern sites. The Fall Symposium meets in late September or early October in the northern part of the State. A Board of Directors meeting is sometimes held at the University of the Pacific in April in conjunction with the Annual History Institute; all members are welcome to attend.

Each of these meetings includes some "how-to" portions as well as history lectures and tours of nearby historical sites.

Visits to local museums are excellent opportunities to pick up "tips" on innovative display techniques, attractive labeling, and other good ideas.

There is a concerted effort to find hosts in the more remote corners of the State, out of the big metropolitan areas, to make it possible for every member of the host-area societies to attend and find out first hand just what the CONFERENCE is as well as to become acquainted with members outside their own areas. The aim is to encourage greater attendance and thereby increase the strength of history in our State.

News of our activities locally is elsewhere in this bulletin. I hope all who can will participate in these activities.

It is the finale to what is known as "FLOSSIE BEADLE WEEK" when, at the Olde Church, photos and information about this colorful person and her efforts to help Lakeside are on display. Come hear entertaining stories about some of Lakeside's famous people, history and even a little gossip.

This year we are honored to present the comparatively newer holiday decorated home of KEN & JOANNE JONES in Lakeside Farms area; the residence of STEVE & GAIL COWEN, Lemon Crest Ranch built in 1898 by architects Hebbard & Gill; MIKE & CHERRY KAY ELKINS unique Casa Linda Vista on Julian Avenue; and the KOUNS-CARENDER-HUFFMAN house (formerly Green Construction) built in 1905, on River Street. Also, for your drive-by pleasure, see a new Lakeside monument, the 100-year-old Oak tree for which Single Oak Drive is named.

Volunteer docents are needed at each of these lovely homes to greet and escort visitors.

All proceeds from the Home Tour go towards restoration of the Old Community Church and Historical Center. **See you there!**

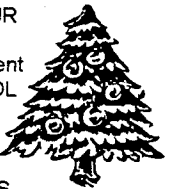

LLOYD "PINKY" FOSTER, died August 28, 1996 at his home. PINKY was born in Lakeside at the Foster Dairy Ranch in El Monte Valley, February 16, 1915. He attended local grammar schools and graduated from Grossmont High School. When he returned

home after WWII, he became an operating engineer and operated his own equipment until his retirement in 1975.

He and his wife, CLARA KERNS FOSTER recently celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary. They were involved in all aspects of their three children's school activities, and enjoyed hunting and camping trips.

Both are life members of the Lakeside Historical Society.

Besides his wife, PINKY leaves two daughters: MARY ELLEN BIRD and HELEN GARNER and one son: CLARENCE "BUZZ" FOSTER. Eleven grandchildren and twenty-two great-grandchildren. One sister, DOROTHY LYONS and five brothers: CHARLES, COKE, DON, BILL and ROGER.

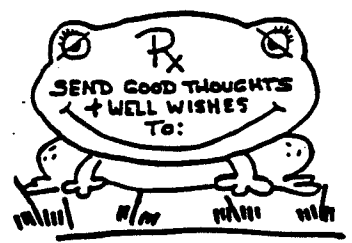

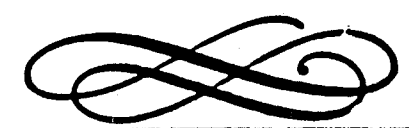
