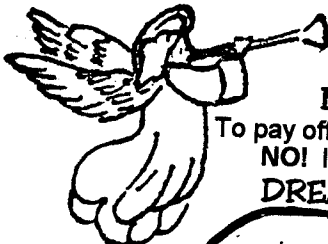
Now is the time to sort out all the pictures that you have collected for years and give them to the Historical Society for our archives so they can be shared. Thanks again.

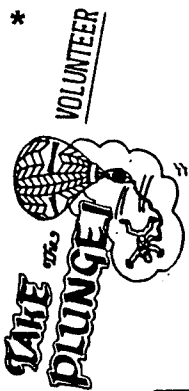

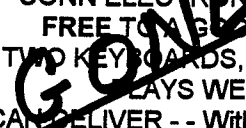

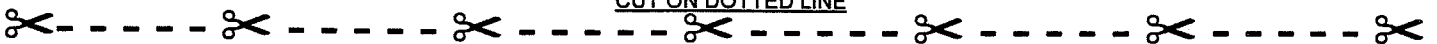

LUCI GYURE - Sympathy is extended to the family of LUCI GYURE who passed away July 30, 1997. She was born in Russia, November 30, 1906; came to America with her parents, and became a United States citizen at an early age. Dancing was her first love - she performed with the Rockettes on Broadway, and had the experience of being in the movies with the Marx Brothers. She traveled extensively and in later years she was an active member of "The Prime Time Players" who performed for our Historical Society on different occasions.

A Memorial Service was held at the Olde Church Thursday, August 7 - a celebration of her life. Survivors include a daughter, Stephanie Gyure; a sister, Olga Puhn; Nieces, Judy Hooper and Terry Clarke and one nephew, Fred Puhn.

GERALD WRIGHT, 95

Masonic Services were held in San Diego for GERALD WRIGHT who died August 7, 1997. He moved to San Diego from Ohio in 1942 where he was an educator. He leaves his wife of 45 years, Grace Wilkinson Wright. Both were avid antique car enthusiasts and he was involved with a number of Antique Car Clubs in San Diego County as well as the Antique Auto Club of America (AACA), serving on the board of directors for 12 years. SAMUEL R. STEWART

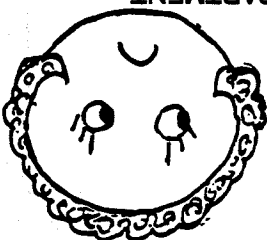

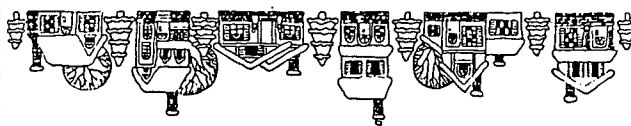
