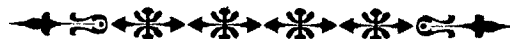

SPIT'N WHITTLE CLUB. The club was formed originally in 1955 to help a March of Dimes Drive. They liked to be called Old Timers and meeting sort of regularly, they told stories polished by time. They met at Lindo Lake Park for a July 4th celebration, at Santee for the opening of the Santee Company Water District recreation lake, at Pioneer Days in Fletcher Hills and various other gatherings.

Among the members were: Cecil Morgan, who used to hunt coyotes and deer at Fanita Ranch in the early 20's. He once worked with Henry Fenton of Bandy Canyon Ranch in San Pasqual. Morgan was a sports writer with Joe Grossman on the San Diego Sun in 1927 when Rayner DeBurn was city editor, and had a half-hour Sunday evening radio program on horse activities called "Tail Switchers" in the late 1940's.

Another member was Charley Stewart, a horseshoer who once paid \$6.00 per month rent for his blacksmith shop at Third and "C" in San Diego.

Others who made their headquarters at the hardware store in Santee, by Morgan, were Edward Walker, Dairyman; Major E.W. MacCawley of La Jolla, whose parents has a 10-acre farm in El Cajon where Whiting-Mead and Benter Brothers later located; Julio Oretaga of Warner Hot Springs; Franklin B. Holder who moved to Santee from Broadway and Magnolia in 1914 and operated a general store until 1948.

Lakeside residents Tom LaMadrid, Walt Hartung and George Miller added much color to the tall tales told at many public appearances.

And, how about the Lakeside Sportsmens Club. Cecil of Cecil's Lakeside Sportsmens Store informed the Star that a project he has been devoting much time and effort on is finally completed. This is the Lakeside Sportsmen Club that boasts of 46 charter members. The first meeting to organize and appoint officers was held at the Scout Hut, February 13. The next meeting was scheduled for February 27 at 7:30 at the Scout Hut where elections will be held. The aim of the Club is to make Lakeside a sportsmen centre and extensive plans are being laid out.

Say, all you storytelling cowboys and poets out there, get 'yer legends and lies together and share them with Lakeside again. Surely, you Lakeside Sportsmen have tales to tell--nothin' like good embellished hunt'n and fishin stories for entertainment--Rattlers, Mountain Lions, Bobcats and Broncos, and the "one that got away". Send your recollections to be included in The

Legends Of Lakeside volume two, which is in the planning process. Or come to a version of the "Spit'n Whittle Club"-The Lakeside Historical Society meetings, 7:00pm, on the 4th Mondays of the month. Please call the history center (561-1886) if you want someone to help you document your story.
